In 1575, Elizabeth I made a 19-day long visit to the home of her great friend, Robert Dudley, where was this? Kenilworth Castle.

Monarchs traditionally stayed at this place before their coronations and processed from this place to their place of coronation. Tower of London.

This Tudor statesman was born in Lincolnshire in 1521, he started his career serving Edward Seymour, he became Secretary of State in 1558 and Elizabeth I called him her spirit. William Cecil, Baron Burghley.

Elizabeth I gave a famous speech to the troops here before they were due to face the Spanish Armada – Tilbury Fort

This Tudor churchman and statesman was born c. 1473 in Ipswich. He was a royal chaplain to Henry VII and then royal almoner to Henry VIII. His church offices included Bishop of Lincoln. Archbishop of York and Cardinal. He died in 1530 on his way to London to face charges of treason. Cardinal Thomas Wolsey.

Queen Jane Seymour is buried in St George's Chapel, Windsor, but her entrails and heart are recorded as being buried in the chapel of this place. Hampton Court Palace.

This Tudor poet wrote poems on the executions of May 1536, wrote "Whoso List to Hunt" and is known for introducing the sonnet into English. Thomas Wyatt the Elder.

This Tudor statesman was imprisoned with his son in the Tower of London in December 1546 and they were both found guilty of treason and condemned to death. Although his son was executed for

treason on 19<sup>th</sup> January 1547, this man escaped death because King Henry VIII died before his scheduled execution. He went on to die a natural death in 1554. Thomas Howard, 3<sup>rd</sup> Duke of Norfolk.

The place where Catherine of Aragon was buried in 1536 and the original resting place of Mary, Queen of Scots. Peterborough Cathedral.

This lawyer was hanged in chains at York on 12<sup>th</sup> July 1537 for his part in the Pilgrimage of Grace rebellion. Robert Aske
